

North Buffalo Township
June 19, 2019

The North Buffalo Township Board of Supervisors met at the Municipal Building at 7:00 p.m., June 19, 2019 with Supervisors Clark Whiteman and Jennifer Matarrese, Secretary Pam Bowser, Police Chief Jason Hufhand, and 15 citizens in attendance.

Vice Chairman Clark Whiteman called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., led the Pledge of Allegiance and made the announcement that the meeting was being audio recorded.

Clark Whiteman made the motion to approve the minutes of the May 15, 2019 Supervisors' Meeting. Jennifer Matarrese seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Jennifer Matarrese made the motion to approve the bills as presented on the Bill List with General Fund checks #26440 through #26492 in the amount of \$48,181.72, General Fund electronic debits in the amount of \$30,539.07, and State Fund checks #710 through #713 in the amount of \$5,118.16. Clark Whiteman seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Clark Whiteman made the motion to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented, with Jennifer Matarrese seconding the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Police Chief Jason Hufhand gave the monthly police report and Ford Cliff Fire Department gave their monthly response report.

Clark Whiteman gave the road master's report. The road crew has been prepping the roads for the upcoming tar and chip project. It was originally scheduled for June 10, but has been postponed until at least June 26 due to lack of time to get the roads ready due to so much rainy weather. The tar and chip project roads take priority to have them ready in time. Once the tar/chip project is completed, the crew can then move on to other projects. During rainy times the crew has been mowing. They also fixed a washout on Hogg Road. The pickup is in the shop for repairs and the buyer picked up the 1993 International.

Under new business, the supervisors reported that the road crew is very short on time to get the roads prepped for the tar and chip project due to the amount of work that needs done and the rainy weather. Belltop and Crane Drive will not be ready in time because Crane needs major work. Therefore, Church Road will be tarred and chipped beginning at Freeport Road to a point for the same amount of footage instead of Belltop and Crane.

The next item under new business was to publically interview the applicants to fill the vacancy for the position of supervisor resulting from the resignation of David Wolfe. The appointment will be for a term to expire January 6, 2020. The remaining two years of Mr. Wolfe's term to expire the first Monday of January 2022 will be on the November ballot. Those residents who submitted applications were Steve Moore, Shawn Simmons, John DiNardo, Michael Valencic, John David Jura and Brett Cloak. All applicants were in attendance with the exception of Mr. DiNardo. The Board of Supervisors posed questions to the applicants and discussed what would be in the best interest of the township. Clark Whiteman then made the motion to appoint Michael Valencic

to the position of supervisor to fill the vacancy left by David Wolfe's resignation. The appointment will expire on January 6, 2020. Jennifer Matarrese seconded the motion, all voted in favor, and the motion carried.

Clark Whiteman reported that trash day, which was held on June 1, 2019, was a success. They filled seven dumpsters.

After public comment, Clark Whiteman made the motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:54 p.m. Jennifer Matarrese seconded the motion, all voted in favor, and the motion carried.
